What's new for 2022

We revised this edition to integrate content from the Medicare Advantage (MA) Provider Operating Guide, the PCP Coordinated Care HMO Plans-Provider Guide, the BlueCard® Provider Guide, and the ID Card-Quick Guide. We hope this more comprehensive "one-source" approach will help you navigate the healthcare, business, and regulatory requirements for the following types of benefit plans:

- Fully insured and self-insured group plans
- Individual/family plans purchased on and off the Exchange
- BCBSAZ-TPA (third-party administrator) co-administered group plans
- Corporate Health Services (CHS) "network rental" group plans (administered by the group's TPA)
- BlueCard (out-of-area) plans from other BCBS Plans
- Federal Employee Program[®] (FEP[®]) plans
- Medicare Advantage and Medicare Supplement plans

If you participate with Health Choice Arizona (HCA), you should continue to refer to the <u>HCA Provider Manual</u> in addition to the BCBSAZ Provider Operating Guide. Dental providers should also refer to the <u>BlueDental SM Provider Manual</u> for more information about our stand-alone BlueDental plans (prefixes 99D and MUM). Most of the other guides mentioned above (including the MA Provider Operating Guide) will be discontinued.

In the 2022 Guide, you'll notice some structural changes in and between the sections where content has been moved and added for better flow. We've also included information about the patient protections in the federal No Surprises Act (NSA), a new process for EFT enrollment and changes, and the revised Arizona telehealth law.
